


Matt 15:18-20


But those things which proceed out of the mouth come forth from the heart; and they defile the man.




Matt 5:17

Part Two: Jesus corrects well known errors of Pharisaical teaching

- Murder is wrong, but hatred unchecked leads to greater judgment.
- 2. Adultery is a sin, but lust is also the sin that leads to adultery.
- 3. Divorce is not a command, but allowed in certain instances.

 Jesus defines and clarifies a mistaken tradition taught by Rabbi
 Hillel that the husband could divorce his wife for anything that
 displeased a husband.
- 4. Oath making Rabbinical teaching had rightly said, "Don't swear falsely, by the name of God. (Lev. 19) However, the Pharisees and taken the liberty to swear by other names and lie. Jesus said let your yea be yea and nay, nay let your word be good.
- 5. Personal Justice or self-Government:
 - Turn the cheek
 - Pay your debts
 - Go the extra mile
 - Personal Charity

At the mouth of two witnesses, or three witnesses...

Two reasons for these directives:

- 1. To insure that the civil government did its job to protect the innocent, ensure peace, punish evil and deter crime:
 - Deut. 19:19-20 "so shalt thou put the evil away from among you.
 And those which remain shall hear, and fear, and shall henceforth commit no more any such evil among you."
- 2. To exact justice, but not to exceed it. No cruel or unusual punishment. The purpose of punishment is justice, not revenge. The punishment was to fit the crime committed.



The Pharisees, however, taken this and twisted it into a mandate for personal revenge over personal insults.


That was not the purpose. We are not commanded to get even when a brother wrongs us, we can forgive through the power of the Holy Spirit.

We are not commanded to repay criticism for criticism or insult for insult. We can answer wrath with a soft answer. That is part of Christian self-government. We can turn the other cheek.







- Luke 24:42-43 And they gave him a piece of a broiled fish, and of an honeycomb. And he took it, and did eat before them.





- Deut. 19:19-20 so shalt thou put the evil away from among you. And those which remain shall hear, and fear, and shall henceforth commit no more any such evil among you.







What about Self Defense?

Est 8:11-9:5

Wherein the king granted the Jews which were in every city to gather themselves together, and to stand for their life, to destroy, to slay, and to cause to perish, all the power of the people and province that would assault them, both little ones and women, and to take the spoil of them for a prey,


...in the day that the enemies of the Jews hoped to have power over them, (though it was turned to the contrary, that the Jews had rule over them that hated them;)

...Thus the Jews smote all their enemies with the stroke of the sword, and slaughter, and destruction, and did what they would unto those that hated them.



Difference between Self Defense and Vengeance Ex 22:2-3 If a thief be found breaking up, and be smitten that he die, there shall no blood be shed for him. If the sun be risen upon him, there shall be blood shed for him; for he should make full restitution; if he have nothing, then he shall be sold for his theft.

But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.


LAWS OF VIRGINIA, FEBRUARY, 1631-2 --- 7th CHARLES 1st.

ACT LI.

ALL men that are fittinge to beare armes, shall bringe their peices to the church uppon payne of every effence, yf the mayster allow not thereof to pay 2 lb. of tobacco, to be disposed by the church-wardens, who shall levy it by distress, and the servants to be punished.

What would Jesus do? What DID Jesus do?

- He was gracious and patient and merciful, but He was also stern and just.
- He didn't compromise the message to attract crowds (John 6)
- He was dogmatic in stating that in Him only was Truth and there was no other way to heaven except through Jesus.
- He was adamant about forgiveness and repentance which naturally accompanied it. (John 8)
- His offer of salvation was open to all who would come to Him (Matthew 11)
- But His message was judgment for those who would not (Matthew 23)
